Thank you for being part of Our Village

In Victoria, more than 800,000 people live in poverty. This includes over 215,000 children, who are the age group most at risk (VCOSS 2024). Too many children are growing up without the essentials most families take for granted: a safe place to sleep, a car seat, a pram, clothing, books and toys. The absence of these basic items is not a minor inconvenience – it's a structural barrier that entrenches disadvantage, compromises safety and wellbeing, undermines children's dignity and limits their future outcomes.

While the challenge is complex, the solution is not. Evidence shows that early provision of basic essentials reduces disadvantage and child protection involvement, strengthens family stability, and supports engagement with early-childhood services.

That's why Our Village exists. We provide the essentials that enable babies and children to thrive, while also reducing waste and creating meaningful volunteering opportunities.

Our 2025 story was one of community impact, stability and partnerships.

Community impact came in the form of supporting more than 50,000 volunteer hours, which were spent sorting, cleaning, safety-checking and packing goods. By rehoming these valuable items, we were thrilled to divert over 208,000 kgs of waste from landfill – the equivalent of around 20 full garbage trucks.

We are also proud to have supported more than 19,000 vulnerable babies and children with safe, practical and beautiful essentials that provide dignity and a secure start in life.

Stability came through achievement of our long-term goal of returning to a balanced budget, strengthening the sustainability of our service for the future.

Finally, we deepened **partnerships** across the community sector, introducing a new registration process and modest administration fee for those able to contribute. We are deeply grateful for the ongoing commitment of our Founding Partners, DECJUBA and L'Oréal Groupe, and for the generosity and impact of all our other philanthropic, individual, corporate and in-kind partners, many of whom are listed within this report. We are privileged to work alongside you.

To everyone who was part of Our Village in 2025, thank you. We look forward to building on this momentum in 2026 and invite you to join us.

Our impact

Supporting babies and children

The attachment between a child and their primary carer in the first 2,000 days of life can impact their health, development and resilience. If there is economic, psychological or physical distress, the ability to develop this bond is at risk.

Our Village alleviates these pressures and creates the opportunity for every child to feel secure, safe and to thrive.

We work with social workers, healthcare professionals and community workers who assess the needs of vulnerable babies and children, placing orders with Our Village for the essential items these children need and would otherwise go without.

In 2025, Our Village supported 19,489 babies and children across Victoria.

We rehomed 66,196 pre-loved items, with a second-hand value of \$7,696,085.

Babies and children supported by Our Village received:

- 13,112** clothing bundles
- 8,708** toy and book bags
- 3,501** linen bundles
- 1,281** prams
- 1,271** car restraints
- 492** high chairs
- 765** cots

The leading reasons items were requested:

1. Unemployment/Underemployed
2. Single parent
3. Mental health
4. Family violence
5. Migrant, refugee or asylum seeker

Our impact

Reducing waste

We're investing our energy into changing the way we consume goods. As part of the circular economy, we're reducing waste and pollution by extending the lifecycle of kids' essential goods through repair and reuse.

We rehome pre-loved items to support children in need today, while also creating a better environment for them to enjoy in the future.

In 2025, Our Village received 273,356 kg of donations and rehomed approximately 208,621 kg, recycling a further 58,603 kg of items that were not suitable for rehoming.

Car seats get a playful second life

Every year, our supporters generously donate more than 1,200 car seats they no longer need, each one offered with the hope it can help another child.

As part of our rigorous safety checks, car seats over eight years old can't be rehomed. With no recycling options available in the past, this meant some seats ended up in landfill.

But that's now changing.

Thanks to Baby Bunting's Car Seat Recycling Initiative, unusable car seats are being given a second life in an entirely new way. Instead of becoming waste, they're repurposed into practical, long-lasting products – from playground equipment to garden pots – extending their value well beyond their original purpose.

With the support of New Vantage Services, car seats that can't be rehomed are collected directly from Our Village and taken for specialist processing.

Since the initiative commenced in July 2025, almost 80 car seats have been diverted from landfill – a big step towards reducing waste and creating a more sustainable future.

Our impact

Volunteer experiences

Our Village was started by volunteers – small groups of mums in St Kilda, Geelong and Ballarat – who collected pre-loved items in their homes. Today, we're a broad village supporting families right across Victoria. But we're still driven by the hard work and care of people who donate their time and skills – the thousands of volunteers who operate across our two warehouses.

We provide opportunities for people to give back, be part of a community of care and impact, develop skills, build friendships and use their talents for good.

In 2025, Our Village was powered by 50,824 volunteer hours.

Listening and learning

Our 2025 volunteer survey found that 96% of volunteers would recommend volunteering to a friend, and their most common personal gains were “making new friends” (68%) and an “improved sense of purpose and self worth” (61.5%).

The social atmosphere and feeling of making an impact were the most powerful values our volunteers experienced in 2025. A third of our volunteers also said they learnt new skills and felt an improvement in their mental health.

Here's more of what our volunteers shared with us:

- *“I love working and sharing with like-minded people whilst helping to improve the lives of those who have less.”*
- *“I love the warm welcome and social connections I have made.”*
- *“I enjoy the friendliness of all the volunteers and the feeling of satisfaction of giving a little of my time to help others. Knowing I've helped to make someone's life a little better.”*

Home heroes

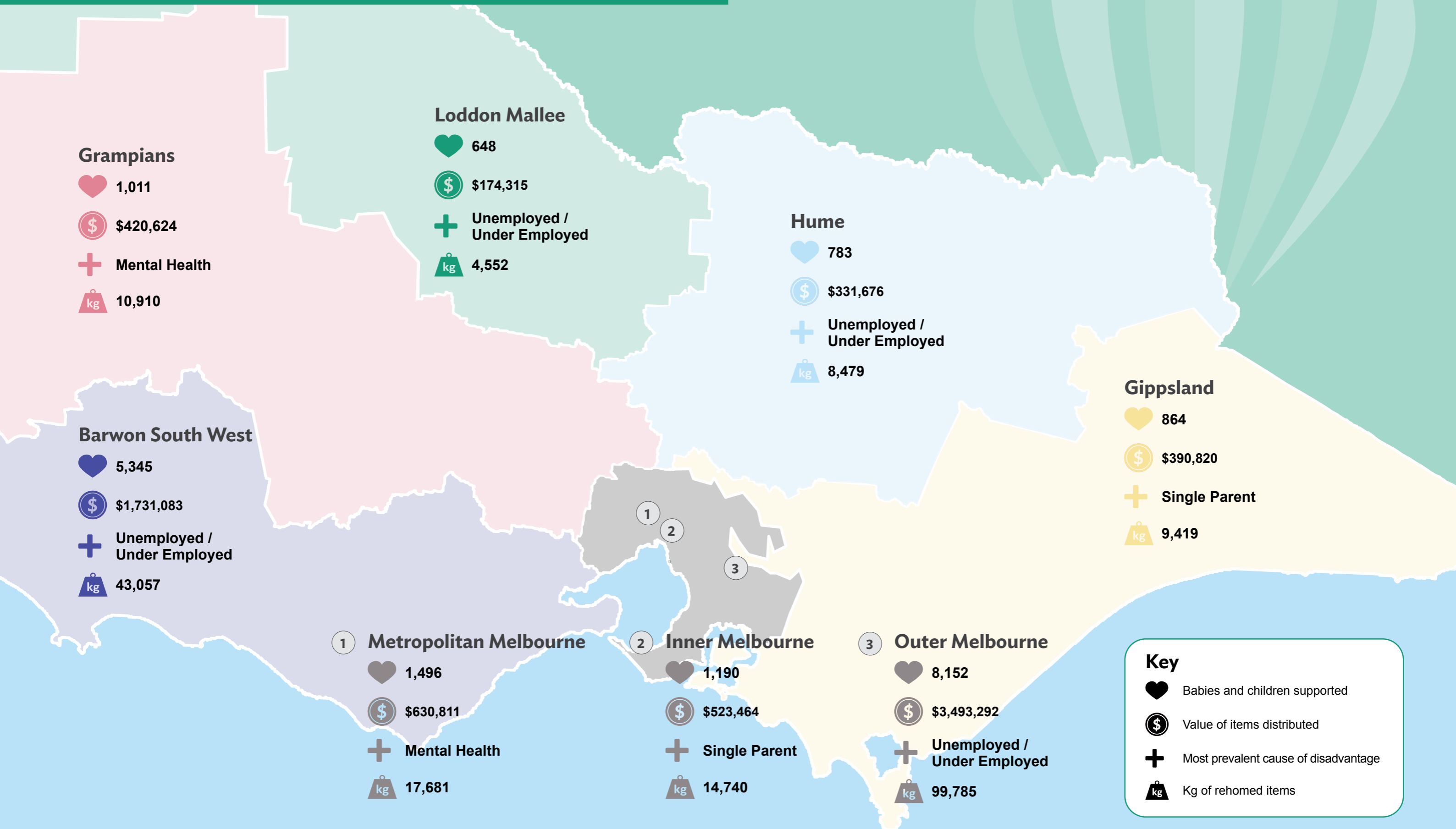

Powerful partnerships

Our community partners

We're so proud to have worked alongside 339 community organisations in 2025, helping social workers and maternal and child health nurses access items that help provide a safe home for babies and children.

Our 2025 case worker survey told us that 100% of respondents either agreed or strongly agreed that receiving items from Our Village reduces anxiety and stress for the families they work with, helps parents feel cared for by the community, and reduces the need for families to spend money on essential items for their children.



Securing our long-term support

We support more than 19,000 of Victoria's most vulnerable babies and children every year. We are passionate about reaching every baby and child that needs our help, but fundraising alone cannot sustain the delivery of our service at these extraordinary levels.

In late 2024, our Board approved a proposal to diversify our income and from January 2025 we introduced a small administration fee for the larger agencies that use our service, to contribute to our operating costs.

The small administration fee is based on the agency's income. It is not a fee for service and is not linked to the number of people accessing the service, the number of babies, children or families supported or the value of goods provided.

We are grateful for the support and understanding we received from our agency partners as we introduced this fee in 2025.

"Our Village has been an absolute lifesaver for our families. We have some of our nans or older women say 'I wish we had this when we had children'. Just the burden it takes off our families is such a relief. They have so many other stresses in their life, especially while pregnant.
